Sue has helped in the search for a new CEO for NHF that should be announced soon.

HFA- has no financial assistance to offer for patients right now.

HFA is restructuring with decisions being made the with CEO and the Board.

In the past they provided extra financial assistance but not this year.

Patients can come to Sue for a grant for patient assistance for \$750 from the Colburn Keenan Foundation.

Sue writes a grant at the end of January to obtain this funding to help patients.

***The Hemophilia Community is the one watching over the Blood Supply for everyone.

6) Advocacy

Hemophilia Assistance Program: if patients don't have insurance the state will help to get the patients enrolled in an insurance plan.

There is an ongoing challenge with United Healthcare and the Prisma System.

North Carolina will be in a similar situation with United Healthcare starting April 1.

Hopefully they can work this all out for the Patient's Sake.

February 27 and 28th is Advocacy Days. Ask Sue about Sponsorship Levels. March 22-24th- Make sure you are signed up to sponsor the Adult Symposium. May 11th- the Walk and Basic Exhibit Level starts at 2500, ask Sue for the additional options like sponsoring pizza, water, etc if you cannot exhibit this year.

Sue needs help since she is having surgery.

Create a walk team (Samantha will be the team leader this year), sponsor the pizza, soda, snacks, etc.

7) HELLO Annual Conference

June 21st and 22nd Annual Meeting.
