Open Enrollment Ends on Jan. 15

*If you have a life-changing event — such as the birth of a child, losing your job, or moving to a new state — you don't have to wait for the next enrollment period. **You can sign up or change coverage within 60 days of the event.** You can also sign up for Medicaid at any time, if you are eligible.*

Please note: Eligibility requirements vary and are dependent upon family income. Working disabled individuals with family income below 250% of the Federal Poverty Level may be eligible for medicaid.

People who are often eligible for Healthy Connections Medicaid benefits include:

- Children
- Breast and Cervical Cancer Patients
- Parent and Caretaker Relatives
- People Over the Age of 65
- People with Disabilities
- Pregnant Women
