Eligibility

- **Ages 5-18.**
 - 18-year-olds will attend as leaders-in-training (LIT) and work side by side with counselors and staff for leadership/counselor development.
- Diagnosed with a bleeding disorder or are a sibling within the immediate family.
- **Must be patients of Prisma Health HTC or members of the BDASC.**

Activities
